Mobile phones ring the changes for marriages and millennial relationships

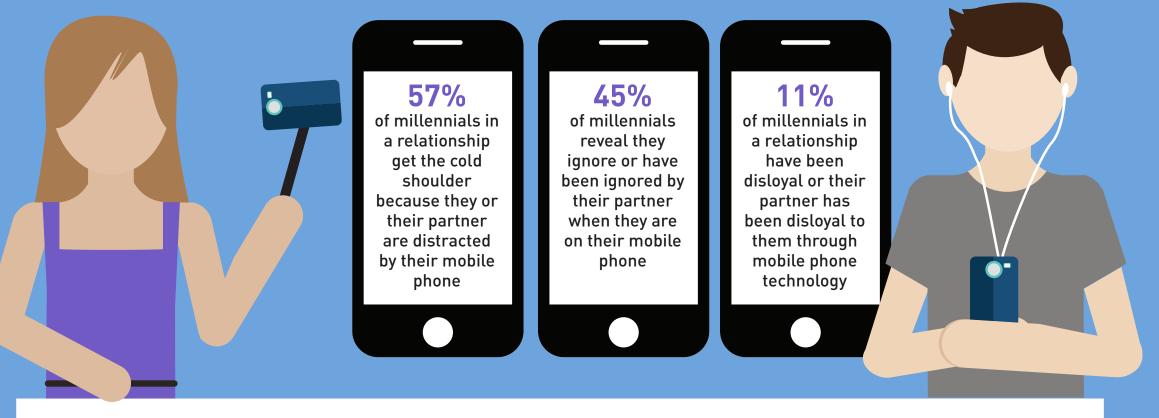
UK adult relationships are suffering

36% of people in a relationship claim they or their partner are distracted by their mobile phones

What people in a relationship said they would be prepared to give up for Seven days

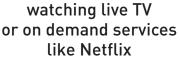
